lotte and wrote the play to suit her style of comedy. It opened on Broadway on 1 October 1995 and **CAROL** was nominated for a **TONY AWARD** the following year for Best Actress in a Play.

What further credentials do you need, to know that this will be a great night out at the theatre!

If you haven't already booked, **do so now** as seats to this show will undoubtedly go fast and you wouldn't want to miss out!

SHAKESPEARE'S GLOBE THEA-TRE-MAIDEN LANE, SOUTHWARK, LONDON

When Shakespeare started writing for the stage in the late 1580s, London's professional playhouses were barely a decade old. The theatre business, as he knew it, was a start up industry the first successful purpose-built theatre had only been built in 1576. Shakespeare knew this venue well: called 'the Theatre' in Shoreditch, it was the home of his company, **the Lord Chamberlain's Men.**

When **the Globe** was built on the Bankside in 1599, materials from 'the Theatre' were re-used in its construction. As well as amphitheatre style playhouses like the Globe and 'the Theatre' which relied on daylight to light the stage, London also had a range of indoor venues, lavishly lit by candles.

Shakespeare's company acquired the Blackfriars playhouse in 1609 and his plays were performed there indoors and outside at the Globe, as well as in a variety of locations including royal palaces, the Inns of Court, universities, town halls and private homes.

<u>Clowning around</u>

The men (and only men were allowed to perform on stage) who played the comic roles in William Shakespeare's company were some of the biggest theatrical stars of their day.

Audiences adored *Bottom* in **A Midsummer Night's Dream** and *Falstaff* in **Henry IV Parts 1 & 2** and **The Merry Wives of Windsor.** Both characters were performed by the same actor, **Will Kemp**, he was the Lord Chamberlain's Men's clown for most of the 1590s and one of the company's original shareholders.

Kemp ensured his popularity with frequent athletic jigs and stand up routines as well as his scripted roles, but his freewheeling performances may have irritated other company members. Shakespeare himself gave some snide words about ad-libbing clowns to **Hamlet.**

After Kemp's departure, Shakespeare's clown parts were taken by **Robert Armin**, who brought his more thoughtful style and fine singing voice to roles such as *Feste* in **Twelfth Night** and the *Fool* in **King Lear**.

<u>Scripts</u>

Actors were only given the script the evening prior to performance or sometimes on the day of performance. They were only given the pages with *their* lines and the two cue lines before —but they never knew which actor would *say* the cue lines.!

Heckling by audience members during a performance occurred when they were dissatisfied by what they were seeing. When this happened the actor would step out of character, stop the play and heckle back. They would only stay in character when they were saying their lines. All other times they sat on the stage watching the play or cleaning their nails or lying about on stage.
